3. Comprehensive Plan Next Phase Review :
Process, Schedule, Action Areas and Products *[Continued from 7/27 CAC Meeting]*

- Sid Sin presented an updated schedule for Action Area review. The Planning Commission met on August 8th and asked for ways to shorten the process. Staff will look for ways to expedite the process. Sid also mentioned that order of Action Area review was altered slightly in order to coordinate Community Connections with the TSP schedule and discuss jobs and economic development before transportation and housing.

4. CAC Comments:

- The CAC reviewed a handout that showed how the Action Areas relate to Oregon's Statewide Planning Goals. There was some discussion about how to identify how the goals relate/are interwoven with the multiple Action Areas. The goals need to be thought of as interrelated and not in silo. It was suggested that each Action Area could have a “main” goal and “informing” goals or a “primary” and “secondary” goals.

- Gregory Monahan: “When speaking of not planning in silos, that is systems-level or holistic planning. That is how sustainability works – an integrated filter or worldview on how complex systems interact.”
