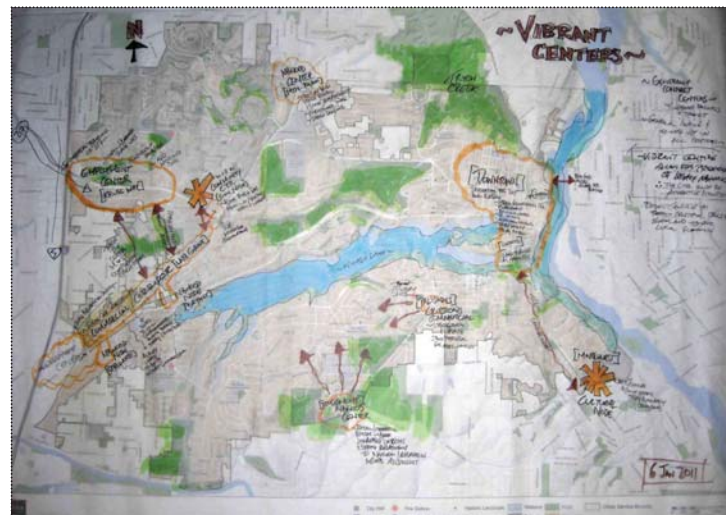


COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: THE SCENARIOS DEVELOPMENT PROCESS



WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY'S VISION FOR 2035?

Lake Oswego's draft community vision for 2035 was based on the input from over 1,300 citizens that participated in the community survey, two community workshops and the vision validation survey.

The vision articulates where the community wants to be in 25 years and will be one of the tools to help guide the update of the Comprehensive Plan.

WHAT DOES THE VISION LOOK LIKE?

Another tool to help guide the update is the preferred community scenario. The preferred scenario is intended to graphically represent what Lake Oswego could look like in 2035.

In January 2011, the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) invited the City Council, Planning Commission and Lake Oswego design professionals (most of which were residents of Lake Oswego) to participate in a design workshop. The intent of the design workshop was to harness the knowledge and creativity of local design professionals to explore ideas of what the draft vision could look like through maps, diagrams, sketches and narratives.

The design workshop also considered what a sustainable community could look like. The City's sustainability framework diagram illustrates that the community's prosperity is highly dependent on its people and its environment. The scenarios were developed within the context of people and places and use the economy as the primary organizing principle.

The preliminary themes that participants worked with included:

- Entrepreneurial Community
- Learning Community
- Vibrant Centers
- Global Lake Oswego
- Eco-Employment Centers

The diagrams on the board illustrate the range of ideas and concepts that were generated at the workshop. Major themes and ideas were pulled from these diagram to develop the Village Centers and LOconomy scenarios currently under review.
